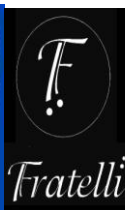
### U10 Joeys (Green 1)

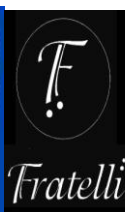

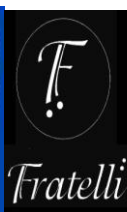

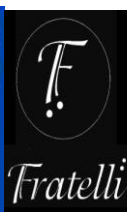
